Eligibility-Who is Eligible

• The LEGION Act - Let Everyone Get Involved in Opportunities for National Service Act — also redefines The American Legion's membership eligibility dates. The eligibility now spans from Dec. 7, 1941, until a time when the U.S. is no longer at war, as determined by Congress.

Currently serving or have been honorably discharged



Eligibility-S.A.L.

• All male descendants, adopted sons, and stepsons of members of The American Legion, and such male descendants of veterans who died in service during the period of April 6, 1917, through November 11, 1918, or any time from December 7, 1941, to date, who served honorably, as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service, shall be eligible for membership in the Sons of The American Legion.



Eligiblity-American Legion Auxiliary

- (1) **grandmothers**, **mothers**, **sisters**, **spouses**, and direct and **adopted female descendants** of members of The American Legion; and
- (2) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who served in either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918 and any time after December 7, 1941 who, being a citizen of the United States at the time of their entry therein served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge;
- (3) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918; and any time after December 7, 1941 who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge.



Eligibility Cont.

 There shall be no form or class of membership except an active membership card.

Dues shall be paid annually or for life.

 No Legion member may be a member at any one time of more than one post.

Eligibility of National Guard & Reserve Components



- Must have served at least one day of federal active duty
- Meet same guidelines as active duty Veterans
- When determining if qualify, look on authority line of orders
- It must say Title 10, subsection 672 or 12301- which are official orders from the Sec. of Defense



Direct Membership Solicitation (DMS or 888's)

- In the Dept. of Ohio these are referred to as 888's
- Signed up through National Headquarters and then placed into Dept. Headquarters Post 888
- Excellent way to increase post membership
- List can be found on the mylegion portal



DMS Cont.

• For the DMS program to be truly effective, it is imperative these new members are personally contacted and invited to transfer in to your post.

 Ultimately, it is the responsibility of every post receiving a transfer to verify the members eligibility by using a DD214 or other official proof of honorable military service.

MEMBERSHIP RETENTION





- Retention is just as important as recruiting if not more so!
- Having a plan to keep your Legionnaires engaged and active is the best way to keep them retained
- This starts when they first sign up. It takes a little more effort, but it effectively increases your recruiting numbers because you're not losing members through attrition



Retention- Emphasize Programs, not your Bar

 The American Legion has enough programs to ensure that there is basically something for everyone.

Recruiting

 Always be ready with a 2-3 minute 'elevator pitch' on the importance and benefits of Legion membership.

Keep a few membership applications handy.

Build and maintain a relationship with military installations



Recruiting

 Build and maintain a relationship with the person in charge of veteran admissions and/or veteran student organizations that may be on college campuses.

 Network with first responders, civic and community organizations, as well as other veteran service organizations to expand your pool of potential members.



Recruiting Continued

- Send a localized version of the post's CPR or Post Impact Report to the media outlets in your area.
- Make sure your post is actively participating in at least one program, and that it is done well.
- Make sure your post is an asset to the community; inform them of your post's programs, participation in parades, service activities, etc.

- Buddy Checks will also assist in Renewing, Retaining and Recruiting!


