Law & Order of the Year Awards Program MUST BE INTO DEPARTMENT BY SEPTEMBER 15

Objective

The objective of the American Legion Department of Ohio Public Service Awards is to select well-rounded public service candidates who have exceeded above and beyond the expected duties of their position for public recognition.

Nominees per District Guidelines

Annually, each District in the Department may only nominate one (1) individual per category:

Law Officer Firefighter Civilian Life Saver

If there is more than one nominee in a category within a District, that District, using any method of their choice, must judge each nominee in that category to determine the one (1) nominee in that category to be forwarded by that District to the Department for Department judging.

Posthumous Nominee Eligibility Criteria – Department Award Only

The Department National Security Commission will consider any Law Officer, Firefighter, or Civilian Life Saver to receive an award posthumously if the death in the line of duty occurred between July 1, 2023, and April 6, 2024, the deadline for all award nominees to be submitted to the Department National Security Commission for judging. The same overall criteria apply to those who have lost their lives in the line of duty as applies to all other Department nominees.

AWARDS POINT SYSTEM

The following Point System shall be used by the Department National Security Commission to judge the nomination package of any Law Officer, Firefighter, or Civilian lifesaver:

I.	Community Service	35 Points
II.	Professional Career	40 Points
III.	Heroism	20 Points
IV.	Letters of Recognition, press articles, and supporting documentation	5 Points

Law Enforcement Officer of the Year

Definition

- 1. Be a citizen of the United States, male or female;
- 2. Be a living, active, full-time and paid, sworn law enforcement officer entrusted with full authority and the powers of arrest
 - **a.** Consideration for a posthumous award will be acceptable only if the nominee's death as occurred after the Department's selection and within the dates for with the award is being presented;
- 3. Be assigned to, or fully recognized by, Municipal, County, District, State Police, Highway Patrol, Sheriff's office, or as a sworn Federal law enforcement officer such as FBI, Secret Service Agent, United States Federal Marshal, National Park Police, Capitol Police.
 - **a.** Military police officers or investigators are eligible for participation in this award provided they are state law enforcement certified.

Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Eligibility Criteria

- 1. A completed application form,
- 2. A 5" x 7" photograph of the nominee,
- 3. A maximum of 18 one-sided pages 8 1/2" x 11."
 - a. The cover page shall not count as part of the maximum 18 pages of service documentation.
 - b. The first six or seven pages should contain the individual's service narrative
 - c. Specific acts of community service, heroism, and meritorious performance recognized by the agency should be included and documented. Additional pages may consist of supporting citations and other documentation to have press articles. The list of Citations/Awards for community service, heroism, or meritorious service received. Citations and Awards may consist of those presented in the previous year.
- 4. The nominee must be recommended by his/her Commanding Officer or Supervisor for the award.
 - a. The commanding officer or supervisor should also state that the law enforcement officer will be available for its presentation at the Department or national convention if selected for this award.

Firefighter of the Year

Definition

For this award, the use of the word "Firefighter" or "firefighter officer" includes any living, active, full-time, paid, or certified volunteer firefighter who is also a municipal or county fire department member. Emergency Medical Technicians, who are serving in some other capacity in the municipal or county fire departments, are also eligible for this award.

- 1. Be a citizen of the United States, male or female;
- 2. Be a certified, living, active, full-time, paid, or volunteer firefighter;
- 3. Be assigned to, or fully recognized by, Municipal, County, District, State or Federal firefighter officer;
- 4. Include a copy of state or federal certification as well as copies of pertinent training and education certificates as appropriate

Eligibility Criteria

- 1. A completed application form,
- 2. A 5" x 7" photograph of the nominee,
- 3. A maximum of 18 one-sided pages 8 1/2" x 11."
 - a. The cover page shall not count as part of the maximum 18 pages of service documentation.
 - b. The first six or seven pages should contain the individual's service narrative;
- 4. Specific acts of community service, heroism, and meritorious performance recognized by the agency should be included and documented. The list of Citations/Awards for community service, heroism, or meritorious service received. Citations and Awards may consist of those presented in a previous year
- 5. Include a copy of state or federal certification as well as copies of pertinent training and education certificates as appropriate
- 6. The nominee must be recommended by his/her Commanding Officer or Supervisor for the award.
 - a. The commanding officer or supervisor should also state that the law enforcement officer will be available for its presentation at the Department or national convention if selected for this award.

Civilian Life Saver of the Year

Civilian Life Saver Nominee Eligibility Criteria

- 1. A completed application form,
- 2. A 5" x 7" photograph of the nominee,
- 3. A maximum of 18 one-sided pages 8 1/2" x 11."
 - a. The cover page shall not count as part of the maximum 18 pages of documentation.
 - b. A list of Citations/Awards (not copies) presented by any City, County, and State authorities, citizens, and civic groups to the individual for the lifesaving event or circumstance for which they are being nominated
 - c. Specific acts of community service, heroism, and meritorious performance are recognized to include press articles.

NOMINATION FOR LAW AND ORDER OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Awards are given to one deserving individual in each category as determined by the Department's Law & Order Commission that has performed above and beyond the call of duty.

Eligibility Requirements

- 1. American Legion Department of Ohio Nomination Form must be submitted
- 2. Please be sure to designate each nomination packet as either *Law Officer*, *Firefighter* or *Civilian Life Saver* nomination.
- 3. An official 5" x 7" head and shoulder color photo must be included.
- 4. Each nominee's submission should be **no more than eighteen (18), single-sided pages**. The nomination packet should include the individuals' service narrative, supporting citations, media coverage, etc.

Failure to adhere to submission criteria could result in disqualification.

Additional Information for Civilian Life Saver Award

The narrative for this nominee should include the contact information (names and addresses) of any individual or group of witnesses to the feat/incident.



HISTORY & INSTRUCTIONS

The Department of Ohio Children & Youth Commission created the Child Welfare Worker of the Year Award to recognize those front-line civilian warriors who work tirelessly on behalf of children every day.

The successes of those who have received this award are the youth who emerge as productive tax paying citizens from all walks of life that may be underserved and at-risk of basic needs of shelter and food. These children may suffer from poverty and broken homes filled with abusive or dysfunctional families that rely upon care and resources distributed, or administered, by the selfless this award recognizes.

Each year, the award recipient chosen by the Children & Youth Commission will receive an award with their name and year ascribed onto the plaque. They will be notified, and the award will be presented at the Mid-Winter Conference Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility and Selection

- 1. The Ohio American Legion Child Welfare Worker of the Year Award is open to professional or volunteer youth counselors throughout Ohio who demonstrate outstanding devotion to the ideals of The American Legion and provide children of Ohio with positive direction.
- 2. Nominations must be submitted to Department Headquarters by <u>September 15th</u>. Nomination forms available on the Department website: <u>www.ohiolegion.com/of-the-year-awards/</u>. Those permitted to nominate include Post officers, County officers, District officers, Department officers and the Department Children & Youth Commission. Acceptance of nominations submitted by anyone other than those noted above will be at the discretion of the Department Children & Youth Commission.
- 3. The Department Children & Youth Commission will review and judge award nominations in October each year. The recipient will be invited to receive the award at the annual American Legion Mid-Winter Conference.
- 4. Selection of the recipient will be based upon judging criteria established by the Department Children & Youth Commission and amended as may be deemed necessary, subject to the approval of the Department Executive Committee.
