POW/MIA

The American Legion is committed to achieving a full accounting of all POW/MIAs from the Gulf War, Vietnam War, Cold War, Korean War and World War II. This means returning living POWs, the repatriation of their remains, or finding convincing evidence why neither of these is possible.

National POW/MIA Recognition Day is always the third Friday in September



National Emergency Fund

•The National Emergency Fund, created in response to Hurricane Hugo in 1989, has provided more than \$8 million in direct financial assistance / American to Legion Family members and posts. By providing this emergency funding, NEF has prevented damaged posts from closing and enabled American Legion Family members to recover from tragedy.

•The fund provides up to \$3,000 for qualified Legion Family members and up to \$10,000 for posts.

Immigration & Naturalization

The American Legion believes in and endorses naturalization.

Providing assistance and instruction to those following the legal path to citizenship has been a longstanding and proud Legion tradition almost since the organization's founding

Many posts, districts and departments have hosted naturalization orientation sessions to teach proficiency in English and lessons in U.S. history and civics.

The American Legion continues to encourage and promote these worthwhile efforts.



Amateur Radio Club

The American Legion has formed a special entity to provide a forum for military veterans who today are engaged in a hobby that can also provide emergency communications "when all else fails."

Amateur Radio Club can be a subsection of a Post's Disaster Preparedness program.



Blood Donor Program

The American Legion Blood Donor Program has existed officially since 1942 to help that cause.

Legionnaires participate by giving blood and reporting it to their posts, which mark the donation on their annual Consolidated Posts Reports. Similarly, posts that host blood drives mark their participation on their Consolidated Post Reports, listing number of drives held and total pints donated (for Legionnaires and non-Legionnaires).
