State Government

- Many state officials and staff throughout Ohio come to Buckeye Boys State to meet with their Boys State counterpart and impart knowledge on the operation of that office.

Elections

- Program educates delegates on Ohio's voting system
- Program utilizes same process and procedures used by many Ohio counties
- All instruction is NON-PARTISAN and Objective
- Two party system FEDERALIST or NATIONALIST
- Party assigned by the program

Elections

- Program teaches the following processes:
 - Caucus
 - Petition/ Candidacy
 - Campaigning
 - Party convention
 - Debate
 - Voting
 - Primary Election
 - General Election
- Winners are inaugurated in a formal ceremony
- Program has 100 percent Voting

Finance

- Provides the Budget to the State Office of Management and Budget
- Provides the starting balances to the Bank
- Assists all agencies with setting their budgets
- Assists Section Heads with automating their payments and collections utilizing the BBS computer network



Ohio State Highway Patrol



- Partner in American Legion Buckeye Boys State program since 1936.
- Three (3) Ohio State Highway Patrol Troopers serve as Highway Patrol detail at Buckeye Boys State.
- Trooper of the Year detail member annually.
- Coordinates Opening and Closing Day traffic patterns.



Ohio State Highway Patrol



- Assists Buckeye Boys State Director in coordinating visits; providing transportation; and security of VIP's to Boys State program.
- Forms a **BUCKEYE BOYS STATE HIGHWAY PATROL**
 - Selects and trains 20 young men on various aspects of Law Enforcement
 - Receive comprehensive training in Ohio Law, Law Enforcement, and the role of a police officer.
- **JUNIOR CADET WEEK**
 - Coordinates with Ohio State Highway Patrol Auxiliary to select young men for “Junior Cadet Week” program at Ohio State Highway Patrol Training Academy.

Legislative

- **BOYS STATE GENERAL ASSEMBLY**
 - Representative (2 per city)
 - Senator (1 per city)
- Process mirrors operation of Ohio General Assembly
- Young men deal with bills, resolutions, budgets, and other legislative concerns affecting the Boys State government.

County Government

County Government

- **Voters will elect:**
 - Mayor
 - Treasurer
 - Auditor
 - Director of Law
 - Councilman (5)

City Government

- Program features Cities which parallel the operation of most Ohio's cities
- Young men in City Offices learn real problems experienced by Ohio Cities
- Elected officials visit their counterpart in Oxford City offices
- City Government is **THE** largest function of Boys State program

Courts

- **Staff consist of:**
 - Attorneys
 - Prosecutors
 - Judges
 - Court of Appeals
 - Common Pleas
 - Municipal Court
 - Administrative staff personnel working in Ohio Courts.
- Citizens must pass a Boys State Bar Examination
- Buckeye Boys State Court System:
 - Supreme Court
 - Court of Claims
 - State Court of Appeals

Courts

- **Voters elect:**
 - Chief Justice of Supreme Court (1)
 - Associate Supreme Court Justice (6)
 - Judge of the Court of Appeals (3)
- Winners are inaugurated in a formal ceremony by the **Chief Justice of the Ohio Supreme Court or an Associate Justice**
- **Boys State Chief Justice swears in:**
 - Elected members of the House & Senate
 - County Elected officials
 - City Elected officials
- Program supported by Ohio Supreme Court



Banking and Realty

- Program teaches personal financial management and responsibilities
- Positions available:
 - Bank officers
 - Tellers
 - Computer operators
- Each citizen initially receives a checking account with \$600 (Boys State money).
- Boys State citizens:
 - Pay Taxes
 - Pay license fees
 - Pay registration fees
 - Pay costs related to maintaining a household and employment within a City, County, and State.
 - Buy their residence (bed) by obtaining a mortgage.

Banking and Realty

- Each Boys State citizen will make deposits and withdrawals in his account by earning monies through a position of employment within Boys state.
- PLEASE NOTE: ALL BOYS STATE FINANCES ARE CONDUCTED WITH BOYS STATE MONEY ONLY.
- Each young man MUST find some form of employment, either through Elective Office, Appointive Office, or the Boys State Bureau of Employment Services.
- Wages paid in any Boys State position are dictated either by Ohio law or the budgetary action of Boys State employers.

School Boards

- Program teaches role of community and State in supporting quality education for its students
- Program consists of functioning School Boards, State Board of Education and State Superintendent of Public Instruction
- Boys State School Board members hire school Administrators, set salaries for education personnel, establish educational policies, deal with budgets, and solve problems similar to the ones facing Ohio educators every day.
- Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio School Board Association representatives will visit the School Boards section during the week

➤ Program has booth at Ohio School Board Association Conference annually

Utilities

- Program operates a number of vital consumer agencies
- Boys State UTILITY COMPANIES:
 - Electric Company
 - Water Company
 - Gas Company
- Utility Companies bill Boys State citizens, Boys State Cities and Boys State Counties for utility services
(ALL PAYMENTS ARE MADE WITH BOYS STATE MONEY ONLY)
- Rates charged by the Utility Companies are governed by the Boys State Public Utilities Commission (PUCO) and other Boys State and Ohio government agencies.

Buckeye Boys State Band



- **Largest Boys State Band in Nation**
 - Band Director and Assistant Director
 - Band Special Counselor
- Band sets tone for much of program
- 125-150 musicians annually
- Play every evening at Program assembly
- Participation does not interfere with other program opportunities
- Young men bring own instruments
- Any type of instrument incorporated

- Secured storage for instruments
- Music provided
- 1st performance 6 hours after arrival
- Echo “Taps”/Memorial Service
- 2nd “Best D----- Band in the Land”

Administration/Boys State Office

- Departs site day after conclusion

- Departs day after conclusion

Campaign Headquarters

- In addition to shaking hands, extensive campaigning is done through the use of signs and posters.
- Materials to make signs and posters are available for purchase (using Boys State funds) at the Boys State Campaign Headquarters and may NOT be brought from home.
- Since the initial funds given each delegate are often not enough to finance their campaign, candidates must solicit donations from their supporters.

- No Automatics
- Performance evaluated during week
- Invitations onto staff are earned
- Frequent planning meetings during year

 - Teaches Federal level of Government
 - Conducted at Marymont College, Arlington Virginia

Special Events

 - Created in 1996
 - Boys State is the only time/place to apply
 - One delegate nominated into National pool
 - Ten National finalists selected
 - \$20,000.00 Scholarship awarded each finalist
 - Three National finalists from Buckeye Boys State program since 1996
- United States Senate Youth Program
 - Sponsored by William Randolph Hearst Foundation
 - Coordinated by Ohio Department of Education
 - Boys State selects and forwards nominees
 - Five thousand dollar Scholarship presented
 - Two from each State selected
