<u>Director's Report</u>

A. Establish 2026 enrollment fee
Rick Gallaher moved to keep the fee at \$300.00. Rodger Wiandt seconded and the motion passed.

B. National Americanism Conference

Director Koppin, President Schmitt, 1<sup>st</sup> VP Looker, 2<sup>nd</sup> VP Kvochick and Christie White attended the conference this year.

Director Koppin said attendance was down drastically this year. As has been the case for the past few years, he believes there is too much attention devoted to Boys Nation and not enough to the needs of the state programs. As usual, most of the good ideas we get come from the break-out sessions.

Christie White noted that we seem to be ahead of many other programs when it comes to making improvements. Some of the problems other programs are facing we dealt with years ago. Her main takeaway is that she be working on the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of USA this year with the Americanism programs..

President Schmitt said the national Legion is pushing for America 250 to be a big deal. They want all the posts to participate with their communities for events and activities with a 250 theme. Ideas can be found at USA250.0rg. We now caucus with smaller programs since our numbers have dropped. They have bigger and worse issues than we do, more so than the big programs. He also noted the recued attendance and attributes this to the conference having less value to the participants than previously, when weighed against the inconvenience and expense of attending.

VP Kvochick attended his first conference. He was surprised that this was the first time had discussed the use of a list server, as the use of these has been standard in the business world for years.

### C. 2025 Program Critique

Director Koppin said last year went well overall. We are already talking with Paula Green to plan for the 2026 program. The campus hot water project is still creating issues with access to facilities, primarily the arena. The University is looking at plans to build a new basketball arena. We don't know how that may affect the program. Paula complimented us on the results of the blood drive. The goal was 185 units and we collected 209 units.

Mark Weldon reported that we will be housed in two different dorms this year. He again stressed the need for accuracy and legibility when filling out the staff forms in the packet.

## Elections – Melissa Fowle

Melissa said she is looking for more volunteers to serve as city commissioners to help with elections. She also expressed her appreciation for all the donations to the Delegates Closet. All donations get used, with any left overs being sent to other area charities at eh end of the program. We are always in need of items in smaller sizes.

## State Government and Visitation – Chris Ballard

Chris Ballard said the staff is working to incorporate more scenario based training for the delegates. They are also trying to find ways improve the delegate experience at the job fair.

## Campaign Headquarters

Grant Grace relayed from Mike Bodie that they are ready to go, and still looking for ways to innovate.

#### County Government – Al Buxton

Al said everything went very smoothly last year, and he is looking forward to 2026.

## City Government–Dick Schuck/Dick Zulch

Dick Schuck reported that the integration of City and County government integration in one building went well last year. He sees no new issues on the horizon.

#### Recreation –Jim Starr

Jim Starr said everything went well last year, and thanked all who helped.

#### School Boards – John Turney

#### Courts

Josh Brown said Court was extremely pleased with how everything went last year. They made use of more mock cases, but would really prefer to have more "real cases" arising from interactions between the various sections.

#### Legislative – Nate Winkleman

Nate reported having another great year. The new room they were assigned suited their needs better. Rodger Wiant thanked everyone for their prayers when he had to leave early last year for a family emergency. He said his grand baby is doing well.

#### Bank & Realty – Jim Hoessle

Jim mentioned they have to add security because someone tried to rob the bank last year. He noted the section has a very strong staff and they are good to go.

#### Utilities

Jacob Marx stated the section ran as expected and they had good participation from the boys.

### <u>Hetuck</u> – Jerry White/Jesse Thomas

Jerry Steve and John for Hetuck. Format changed significantly last year, can always used feedback. Worked well for delegates. Web site continues to be updated.

## Chief Counselor – Grant Grace

Grant reported that Dr. Crawford, Miami University President, wants to be more directly involved in our program. The result of those discussions is that we will have a university in each county next year. The delegates will have the opportunity to work with Dr. Crawford and members of his staff.

Grant also noted that this year they both pre and post surveys of the delegates and reported some of the numbers. One of the results was finding that 59% of the delegates bought a city photo, therefore 41% did not. The Counseling staff is looking at less expensive options for taking and producing the photos, and giving all delegates a photo at no cost. Discussions between his staff and headquarter is ongoing.

Grant also observed that the Ohio Youth Leadership Initiative Foundation is working on a poster to send to posts to try to increase post participation. Todd Gerber set up a virtual college fair for Girls State last year and is trying to set up an in person one for them.

#### Band –Jeff Jordan

This year's band was one of best of the last few years. Some of the kids could actually sight read music which is a big plus. The delegates learned a record 65 songs in one week. Jeff also noted some of the special moments the band had this year such as the trumpet quintet for the National Anthem and the student bagpiper playing to the empty chair.

## Mini Mall – Charlie Kvochick/Tim Conway

Charlie expressed appreciation for all the support he gets. He is looking into suggestions for items to sell that delegates mentioned in their surveys.

### Public Relations – Jerry White/Steve Oechsle/John Vrzal

Jerry White noted that 2026 will be the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Ohio Buckeye Boys State. He sees this as an indication of a successful program. For those looking for a Veterans Day speech, one can be found on the National web site. SAL Squadron 725, the BBS squadron, sponsored 15 delegates to the program last year. He also wants to do something to publicize the delegate's closet.

#### Computer Support – Rick Gallaher/Evan Anderson

Rick noted that the problems we had with the wi-fi last year should not re-occur.

"No Shows" – Rich Ching

We had a total of 11 no shows in 2025.

Jeff Jordan noted getting excellent feed back from Dr. Postle, our inductee last year. Our changes to stage program worked well with the inclusion of other prior inductees.
