#### Department of Veterans Affairs Benefits for Veterans

VA burial allowances are flat-rate monetary benefits. They help cover eligible Veterans' burial and funeral costs. These amounts are periodically updated so check with the local VA when the time comes or call your Service Organization.

For service-connected deaths:

If the Veteran died on or after Sept. 11, 2001: maximum \$2,000

If the Veteran is buried in a VA national cemetery: some or all of the costs of transporting remains

For non-service-connected deaths:

If the Veteran died on or after Oct. 1, 2019: \$300 burial allowance; up to \$796 for funeral expenses and a \$796 for plot-interment allowance.

Payable rates are higher **if the Veteran was hospitalized by VA** at time of death.

(These amounts are all correct as of November 2022)

Pre-need eligibility for Burial in an VA Cemetery can be filed by the veteran. Making the burial process easier. Submit the VA Form VA40-10007
