

I hope you are healthy, happy and safe as we

round out the second quarter of our membership and fiscal year. We realize the difficul-

ties surrounding re-opening your Posts for meetings, gatherings, fellowship, and events. COVID Relief Grants are available in the amount of \$5,000 for all brick and mortar Post locations through the Ohio Office of Budget and Management (OBM). Recently, \$10,000 became available for any establishment with D4 and D5 licenses, in addition to the VSO COVID grant. These monies are available until 31 DECEMBER 2020. They are easy to obtain. You can search here for resources: https://www.greaterohio.org/covid19-relief and https://grants.ohio. gov/fundingopportunities.aspx.

Lastly, I would like to mention the progress of Post reviews and Post compliancy taking place at HQ. We have been reviewing every Post file, transferring to electronic, reviewing last two membership cycles, checking the Secretary of State business filing registrations, IRS 990 and 990N filings, liquor licenses, and Constitution & By-Law updates. What we are discovering is that most Posts have not updated their C&BL in the last five years. A large majority are at least 10 years or more. Some Posts have also allowed their Federal Tax Exemption to lapse by not filing an IRS Form 990 or 990EZ three years in a row. There are also Posts who have simply abandoned their post and never formally, legally, and properly, filed for Post closure or

sold the Post property. We are reviewing every file and reaching out to every Post by phone, email, and a letter to inform the current leadership of any deficiencies that need to be corrected for your Post to operate legally in the State of Ohio. We are here to help you get these things corrected! If you receive one of these letters, please reach out to myself, the Judge Advocate, or a Department and District Officer to seek guidance. We fully understand you may have inherited these issues and if you are in a Post leadership position, it is now your responsibility to make it right. Operating a Post is a "nonprofit small business" opportunity. There are laws we must follow and a lot of RESOURCES to help. Please email or call me directly at 740-513-1550 if you have any questions about this process.

## Department Executive Committee Summary - August 1, 2020

The Department Executive Committee was called to order on Saturday, August 1, 2020 at 10 am via virtual video conference. A quorum was present. Due to this meeting being a large group, it was difficult to obtain all the names of guests and Past Department Commanders present. SAL Detachment Commander Bernie Kessler, and American Legion Riders Liaison, Jack Nix, were present to bring greetings on behalf of our American Legion Family. Kristen Little, TAL Auxiliary President was not available.

Officer Report SAL CMDR Bernie Kessler (5): CMDR Kessler mentioned Past SAL CMDR Rick Riviotta from Squadron 610 passed away in late July. He also mentioned that at the SAL DEC, they approved the closure of Squadron 717 (Paper Post and meeting at VFW in North Ridgeville) in 5th District. Upon meeting with the Post CMDR, it was to be revitalized and held until the SAL Fall Conference (No Ouorum at SAL Fall Conference 10/17/2020). Posts still hosting Poker Runs and doing what they can to reduce COVID spread. Newark, Lorain-Amherst, and Kent. Partnering with Ohio Patriot Riders and Combat Vets Association. Ohio ALR POW/MIA Run is scheduled for September (cancelled). Ride and Grab Program with different posts is also on hold. Statewide ALR Meeting in October at Pickerington Post.

Report from Historian, Al Beyer (5): Posts are grateful that someone comes to see them and how good it feels to visit them with all their good ideas. Concerns are military honors for veterans. The Officers guide has the guidelines for the Post History Contest and how to make and submit a History Book for the Post. Pages 140-149 and on TAL website (www. legion.org). National Historian, Jim Mariner, advised that the 2019-2020 contest deadline has been extended, directed by National Adjutant Wheeler, due to cancellations and postponements of programs. New Deadline for Post History Books is February 2, 2021 for Department and April 2, 2021 for National. Do not confuse new date with the 2021 History Contest. That is still the same deadlines. Report from NECMAN, Robert Klostermeier (1): Not hearing much from National other than membership reports for TAL and SAL. No information on Fall Meetings yet. NEC meeting and Commander and Adjutant meeting is also being adjusted. Received CPR Report from IA and Ohio was 16th Place and submitted 448 CPR's out of the 528, for a total of 85%.

Report from Alternate NEC-MAN, Steve Masowick (9): If Bob's here, I'm good.

Report from PDC Robert E. "Bob" Schmitt (1): Nothing other than everyone gets to contribute in the Membership Workshop which is a good thing.

Report from Judge Advocate, Doug Whitney (3): Post Constitution & By-Laws and Post Articles of Incorporation are important for IRS and Ohio Licensing, property ownership, and tax matters. The name in the Articles of Incorporation, Constitution & By-Laws, and all licenses and property deeds, must be identical. Many of them are not, which could cause problems in the future. The stated purpose of the Post corporation should be word for word as stated in the latest version of The American Legion Preamble to the Constitution. The membership criteria must also be current based on the most recent expansion of eligibility from the Legion Act. Please encourage your District Judge Advocates to look at these documents to ensure they are up to date and amended. Post Officers manual on Page 23 has guidance. Election season is upon us and we need to remember to be non-partisan. No campaign buttons or personal views may be expressed or seen, as a Legion member. We must make our Posts available to all parties, not just one. Any Legion apparel must be removed from the meeting. Legion caps or attire may not be worn while attending a rally or party meeting. Violations of these rules may jeopardize the tax exemptions granted for Legion donors under section 501c-19 of the US Code. Doug mentioned having heart surgery scheduled for August 10th (Surgery successful).

Report from Parliamentarian, Jerry White (8): Jerry reported as Parliamenterian and the Chair-

Committee. Recommendations were made to Commander Friend who would serve on this Committee by CHRMN White and the following were appointed: Department Judge Advocate, Doug Whitney (3), PDC Ron Chapman (4), PDC Richard Zulch (1), Department Adjutant Suzette Heller (Ex-Officio) (12). Motion made by Treasurer Charles Stennis (9) and seconded by Richard Wright, (13) and passed unanimously. Tasks of Committee is to review the Five C&BL Resolutions passed by DEC in the previous year for thorough review prior to going to Convention in 2021. Committee is already at work. Also reviewing C&BL for recommended changes and necessary updates. Committee will also review the most current rules of the Department Executive Committee, recently updated, to ensure everything is aligned properly.

Report from Department Adjutant Suzette Heller (12): Post Inspection and Post Selection Sheets were discussed. The Post Selection sheets allow a Post to indicate specific details about the Post that an 888 member can review and determine which Post they would like to join. There is a question on the bottom of the sheet where the Post can indicate that they agree to "automatically receive 888 members for review." This allows an 888 member to be transferred into a Post of their choosing, based on the information on the Post Selection Sheet. Posts can receive new members for review to expand their American Legion family. Post Inspections performed by District Commanders MUST be done by MARCH 30st, 2021. The Department Finance Committee, and DEC, approved a policy that the Department will no longer deduct Emblem Sales expenses from the District Activities Funds for DEC members. Each year, every Department receives Royalties from The American Legion Flag & Emblem Sales. The Department will use these funds to purchase a cap and badge for DEC members and they will be expected to purchase their own ties. What we will expect is that a POST IN-SPECTION is performed on every Post, every year. District Activities, District Commander, and District 1st Vice distributions will be withheld until 100% Reporting of Post Inspection Forms are submitted to Department HQ. If this is done by the March Deadline, there shouldn't be any problem getting those monies distributed immediately after 1 July each year (Revenue based on final membership reporting on 30 June every year). Adjutant Heller Proposed a monthly DEC conference call for DEC. Secretary of State Frank LaRose campaign "Second Call to Duty" to increase volunteers for poll working during upcoming election. Due to COVID19, large majority of current volunteers are compromised with health conditions that make them vulnerable. Our goal is to keep our members safe.

Report from National Security Chairman, Al Buxton (4): Chair-

man of the Constitution & By-Laws man Buxton reported on the activities of the National Security Committee meeting at Department HQ on July 11, 2020, at 10am. POW-MIA Program sold \$300 of pins which cost over \$850. Committee requested \$3,000 from Charities, Inc., for POW-MIA Fund to assist supporting the military by supporting Central and Southern USO Program. Blood Donor Program had 2,086 donors from Posts who donated 4,577 pints of blood. Encouraging Posts to support Red Cross Blood drives. Rick LaValley, 7th District, mentioned wrongdoing at Post's regarding money, stealing, and mismanagement. Recommended a resolution to make the National Security Committee to be responsible for Post auditing and problems. Members of Committee to write resolution is Jose Rivera, (9), Rick La-Valley (7), and Doug Russell (10). No Good of the Legion reported and meeting concluded at 11:30 am.

## **2020** Appeal Number the Cleveland VA Regional Office

Conducted 62 BVA Hearings. 21 have been issued a decision with 18 of those being wins for the veteran. This puts the DSO's win percentage at 86% for 2020 and have secured \$654,274.73 for Ohio veterans.

## 2019 Appeal Number the Cleveland VA Regional Office

BVA success 77% with \$1,042,453.56 in BVA Grants and additional \$483,962.70 through BVA Remand.DRO Success 48% with \$64,584.23 in DRO Grants.

## 2018 Appeal Number the Cleveland VA Regional Office

BVA Success 74% with \$1,645,084.30 in BVA Grants and additional \$340,311.51 in BVA Remand.DRO Success 57% with \$207,345.70 in DRO Grants.

## 2017 Appeal Number the Cleveland VA Regional Office

BVA Success 80% with \$2,943,711.25 in BVA Grants and additional \$1,090,384.04 in BVA Remand. DRO Success 70% with \$586,577.09 in DRO Grants

Collectively since 2016 the DSO's have secured over \$10,082,664.50 for Ohio veterans and maintained a 80% Success rate at the Board of Veterans Appeals and 62% at the Decision Review Officer level (hearing % is 2017 to Present data).

I have served the past eighteen years as Americanism Chairman, Children and Youth Chairman, and Golf Chairman for Post 184 in Piqua. I am a Past Commander of Post 184 and served as Adjutant for 11 years. I am currently the Assistant Adjutant and Post Service Officer. I joined the American Legion Department of Ohio as a Department Service Officer on September 28, 2020. #### COURT OF APPEALS VETER-ANS CLAIMS (CAVC) DECI-SIONS BENEFICIAL TO VET-ERANS

I want to share a few CAVC decisions that the Department Service Officers have found helpful with arguing for our veteran's. Our Partnership with Bergmann & Moore whom handles all CAVC cases for the American Legion has provided some great insight and breakdowns of these cases. These are for information purposes to info veterans. Please seek guidance and assistance through the DSO to prefect your claim.

Miller v. Wilkie Vet. App. No. 18-2796: The Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims (Court) opinion in Miller holds that a VA Compensation and Pension examination (C&P exam) is not adequate if it does not address the Veteran's relevant lay statements. This is helpful to Veterans because it reaffirms the duty of a C&P examiner to review the entire claims file and analyze the full picture of the Veteran's condition as part of the C&P exam process.

\*This case is extremely helpful in claims for Tinnitus as the VA often

denies Tinnitus due to no diagnosis or treatment in service.

McCray V. Wilkie Vet. App. No. 17-1875: The Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims (Court) opinion in McCray holds that VA must address medical research evidence submitted by a Veteran to rebut a negative VA medical opinion.

\*This case in useful when the VA examiner fails to service connect on the C&P Exam. In the VA ultimately the burden of proof lies on the veteran to prove the condition is caused by service. Under this case we can submit medical literature to support the condition and its link to service. For example, a medication that is known to cause adverse side effects. It is also useful in arguing hearing loss by using the National Academy of Science and Engineering study on hearing loss.

Euzebio v. Wilkie Vet. App. No. 17-2879: The Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims (Court) opinion in Euzebio holds that VA adjudicators are permitted to ignore the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering & Medicine (NASEM) report, Veterans and Agent Orange: Update 2014 (10th Biennial Update 2016) if the report is not submitted as evidence in an individual **Veteran's claim.** This is bad news for Veterans suffering from conditions that may be related to exposure to Agent Orange. However, advocates can overcome the effect of this decision by helping Veterans to submit the NASEM report as evidence in their claims. Included with the analysis about Euzebio is a document, "NASEM Veterans Agent Orange Update," which contains language to submit to VA for relevant claims.

\*This case is helpful to Vietnam Veterans with Bladder cancer, hyperthyroidism, and or Parkinsonlike symptoms or Parkinsonism. As most of you are aware the NAS-EM which has found suggestive or sufficient evidence for three conditions those mentioned above to be added to the presumptive serviceconnection for Vietnam veterans.

#### REGIONAL OFFICE VERSE THE BOARD OF VETERANS APPEALS

It is important to know the difference when selecting the proper appeal route to take. The VA Regional Office is bound by the 38 C.F.R. Federal Veterans Laws, Rules and Regulations as well as the M21-1. The Board of Veterans Appeals is bound by the same with the exception that case law is also reviewed and put into play not limiting a decision based solely on the 38 C.F.R.

Through a practical, objective, nonpartisan approach, participants in the American Legion Buckeye Boys State program are ex¬posed to fundamental democratic principles in local, county and state elections and governmental functions which prepare them for leadership roles as patriotic American citizens.

#### **AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL**

American Legion Baseball is the finest summer baseball program for high school students in Ohio and the na-tion today. American Legion Baseball serves as the larg¬est source of talent to major league teams of any youth baseball program. In 2018, over

55% of all players on 30 major AMERICANISM AND league team rosters played American Legion Baseball. For these past 94 years American Legion Base¬ball has strived to maintain the reputation as the highest regarded youth baseball program in the nation.

#### **ORATORICAL**

The Oratorical Program is a function of The American Legions "Americanism Pillar". The Oratorical Program is a constitutional speech contest for high school students. The contest has a prepared oration and an as-signed topic which is assigned the day of the contest. The prepared oration must be on some aspect of the Constitution, with emphasis on a citizen's duties and obligations to our government. The same subject and oration used in the department contest must be used in the national contest. The purpose of the assigned topic discourse is to test the speaker's knowledge of the subject, the ex-tent of his or her research, and the ability to discuss the topic as related to the basic principles of government under the Constitution.

## **GOVERNMENT TEST PROGRAM**

Created in 1936, the Americanism and Government Test program is a joint venture and partnership with the Ohio American Legion Auxiliary, which is a cosponsor of the program. The A&G Test is open to students in grades 10, 11, and 12 and is a fifty (50) question test comprised of True/False, multiple choice, and fill-in the blank. The Award from the Ohio American Legion for 18 State winners is a five (5) day, all expenses paid trip to Gettysburg, Pennsylvania and Washington D.C. with the highlight of the trip being a Wreath Laying at the Tomb of the Unknowns at Arlington National Cemetery, which has been a tradition since

## The American Legion Department of Ohio Scholarship

#### **HISTORY**

The American Legion Department of Ohio Scholarship was established in 1971 to assist deserving high school students and veterans attending institutions of higher learning with the ever-increasing costs of higher education.

#### ONE TIME SCHOLARSHIP **AWARD**

The scholarship offered by the American Legion Department of Ohio is a ONE TIME NON- RE-NEWABLE award.

#### SCHOLARSHIP APPLICA-TION DEADLINE

All scholarship applications mailed to the American Legion Department of Ohio State Headquarters in Delaware, Ohio must be received by or postmarked by APRIL 15 annually.

#### SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION / **NOTIFICATION**

All scholarship applications received will be reviewed by the American Legion Department of Ohio Screening Committee in mid-May with scholarship recipients and non-recipients to be notified via surface mail or e-mail as soon as possible thereafter.

#### Scholarship Judging Criteria

The judging criteria utilized by the Ohio American Legion Scholarship Screening Committee to choose the recipients for any scholarships awarded shall be based upon:

The applicant's academic achievement based on course grades; difficulty of the curriculum; ACT scores; participation in school activities and activities outside of the school and

a general impression of each applicant's character obtained through a personal statement.

The American Legion Department of Ohio Scholarship consists of the following categories and the criteria required for each category are:

#### **High School Award**

High school awards, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of the Ohio American Legion, are awarded annually to selected high school seniors, including home schooled and online students, attending high school within the state of Ohio.

#### Requirements:

- Open statewide.
- Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion or a direct descendant of a deceased member of the Ohio American Legion who was in good standing at the time of death.
- Applicant must have a high school and college (if taking college courses) GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Applicant must have an ACT score of 25 or higher.

The amount of each American Legion Department of Ohio high school award will be contingent upon the annual earnings of the Scholarship Fund.

#### **College Student Award**

An American Legion Department of Ohio scholarship may be awarded annually to a college student.

#### Requirements:

- · Open statewide.
- · Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion or a direct

descendant of a deceased member of the Ohio American Legion who was in good standing at the time of

- Applicant must have a high school and college GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Applicant must have an ACT score of 25 or higher.

The amount of each American Legion Department of Ohio college award will be contingent upon the annual earnings of the Scholarship Fund.

#### Donald L. Lanthorn Award

Donald L. Lanthorn was a lifelong resident of Licking County who served as the State Director of Veteran's Affairs and Rehabilitation for the Ohio American Legion State Headquarters for forty (40) years.

The Donald L. Lanthorn award, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of the Ohio American Legion, is awarded annually to one (1) selected high school student, including home schooled and online students, or veteran residing in and attending high school in Delaware, Knox, Licking, Madison, Marion, Morrow or Union counties. Those applicants not selected for the Lanthorn scholarship may still be eligible for other Department of Ohio scholarships.

#### Requirements:

- Restricted to high school, home schooled, online or veterans residing in Delaware, Knox, Licking, Madison, Marion, Morrow or Union County.
- Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion or a direct descendant of a deceased

gion who was in good standing at the time of death.

- Applicant must have a high school and college (if attending college) GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Applicant must have an ACT score of 25 or higher.

The amount of the Donald L. Lanthorn scholarship will be contingent upon the annual earnings of the Scholarship Fund.

#### **Durward I. Bernhard Award**

Durward I. Bernhard was a lifelong resident of Belmont County who at the time of his passing, through his estate, provided funds to the American Legion Department of Ohio with the stipulation these funds be used to directly benefit the higher educational pursuits of Belmont County high school students, including home schooled or online students, or veterans residing in Belmont County.

The Durward I. Bernhard award, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of the Ohio American Legion, is awarded annually to one (1) selected Belmont County high school student, including home schooled and online students, or veteran residing in Belmont County. Those Belmont County applicants not selected for the Bernhard scholarship may still be eligible for other Department of Ohio scholarships.

#### Requirements:

- Restricted to high school, home schooled, online students or veterans residing in Belmont County.
- Applicant must be a direct descendant of a current paid member of the Ohio American Legion

- Applicant must have a high school and college (if attending college) GPA of 3.5 or higher.

#### American Legion/Military Award

One (1) award, as chosen by the Scholarship Screening Committee of the Ohio American Legion, is awarded annually to a selected American Legion/Military applicant. The applicant must show proof of being a current, paid member of the Ohio American Legion and of serving in the United States military. Requirements:

#### • Open statewide.

- Applicant must provide a copy of current year Ohio American Legion membership card.
- Applicant must provide a copy of DD214, Report of Separation from Military Service or if currently on active duty, a copy of the military identification card.

The amount of the award to an American Legion/Military applicant will be contingent upon the annual earnings of the Scholarship Fund.

It is important that The American Legion Riders do our part to protect the American Legion family. These changes have been implemented to protect what the American Legion stands for. The intent of the resolution is not to infringe on anyone's right, but to ensure that the values of American Legion Family are upheld.

Open carry of a firearm is not permitted while wearing Legion Riders gear, or the American Legion logo. This does not affect your right to conceal carry.

Resolution No. 19: Updated Programs Guidelines for the American Legion Riders (ALR) **National Program** 

RESOLVED, By The National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled virtually on October 14-15, 2020, That all American Legion Riders (ALR) groups be a program supported by a post or department of The American Legion and shall uphold the declared principles of The American Legion as well as conform to and abide by the lawful regulations and decisions of the department, post or other duly constituted department governing body; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that because The American Legion owns, controls, protects and defends The American Legion's Emblems, the following guidelines are required to dictate protective standards over the Emblems:

- 1. All members of the American Legion Riders shall be current members of The American Legion, Sons of The American Legion or American Legion Auxiliary.
- 2. Each ALR member shall establish and maintain membership by owning, individually or through marriage, a motorcycle licensed and insured as required by state law.
- 3. ALR programs may allow for continued membership for those members who have given up motorcycle ownership because of age, illness, injury, or other reasons outside the member's control.

4. All ALR members shall maintain the image of The American Legion and, protect the trademarked names and emblems, which symbolizes the integrity and principles of The American Legion organization.

5. The American Legion Riders officers shall be called chairman, vice chairman, director, and/or assistant director. Commander and vice commander are not appropriate because the American Legion Riders is a program of a post or department. In order to retain the identity of the ALR as an association of motorcycle enthusiasts and not as a motorcycle club or biker club, the titles of "president, vice president and past president/vice-president" shall no longer be permitted. A transition period of one year from the date of this resolution's passage will be provided for departments/posts to update governing documents and to transition to these approved ALR leadership titles.

- 6. The only recognized American Legion Riders emblem and logo authorized are those sold through The American Legion Emblem Sales. No use of rockers touching the ALR patch are allowed because touching the ALR patch violates the trademark laws protecting the ALR patch.
- 7. ALR vests should display the integrity, principles, and values of The American Legion and the ALR by avoiding patches or

pins with explicit or offensive language or images. All patches and pins of any groups displayed on the ALR vest shall share like values of The American Legion with regard to improving the lives of veterans, the military, the community and families, and these groups must be supportive of the principles of justice, freedom, democracy, and equality for all.

8. To maintain the image of The American Legion and its programs, ALR members while wearing any American Legion Riders apparel shall not display exposed weapons.

9. The American Legion Riders must represent the virtues, values, ethics, and morals of The American Legion in support of freedom, democracy, and the safety of our citizens. Affiliations of ALR programs with other groups and organizations that subscribe to the principles of and oppose our form of government by promoting anti-Americanism, anti-establishment, or pro-criminal culture shall not be permitted.

10. All ALR members shall obey the motorcycle laws of their state. This includes the proper motorcycle license endorsement in accordance with the rider's home state.

11. The sponsoring organization (post and department) will review liability insurance coverage to ensure that adequate coverage is available to cover the organization to include coverage for any specific special riding events; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That The American Legion Riders programs shall abide by The American Legion National Constitution and National By-laws, as well as the established post and department directives; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That The American Legion National Headquarters and the respective departments shall maintain general oversight of the American Legion Riders program in regards to proper use of the Emblems of The American Legion, The American Legion Riders, and The American Legion Legacy Run, and compliance with The American Legion National Constitution and National By-Laws; and, be it finally

RESOLVED, That Resolution No. 35 (NEC, Oct 2007), Subject: "American Legion Riders as a National Program" and Resolution No. 32 (NEC, May 2011), Subject: "Amend Resolution 35 (NEC, Oct 2007), Subject: American Legion Riders as a National Program" are hereby superseded and rescinded.



## The American Legion Blood Donor Program

The American Legion Blood Donor Program was established in 1942 during World War II to cover the growing need for blood and plasma at home as well as war fronts. American Legion Posts worldwide were collecting blood for The American Red Cross. In May 1942, The Civil Defense Committee presented six resolutions to the National Executive Committee, and blood donation was presented first as a priority. The resolution passed as follows:

Whereas, The Army and Navy have requested 380,000 pints of blood by July 1 and 900,000 in the next 12 months; there is also great need for plasma in civilian defense plants and service;

Whereas, At present, the Red Cross can take care of 18,300 donors a week or 201,300 by July 1; therefore, be it

Resolved, That The American Legion deems it is an advisable and essential part of civilian defense that there be a wide expansion of the blood donor program and further establishment of blood bank centers, making such facilities available within each state in the Union; and it is urgently rec- for blood donations. The Ameriommended that appropriate steps be taken to accomplish this end.

That was the first resolution of many from The American Legion that supported blood donation and the American Red Cross.

In 1967, The National Executive Committee passed a resolution designating the week of Dec. 7 each year as "National American Legion Blood Donor Week," in remembrance of the attack that sent the nation into World War II and gave birth to the Blood Donor Program.

In 1985, the National Executive year's time. The National Commander's Blood Donor Award program continues today. The Departments that have the highest turnout for Legionnaires and Post participation are honored at National Convention.

According to the American Red Cross, all the American Legion posts put together nationwide are ranked number 4 in their top 100 Enterprise Organizations in 2020

can Legion nationwide has collected 31,804 red blood cell units.

The American Legion Department of Ohio Headquarters has hosted 5 blood drives, collecting 140 total units of blood. 51 of our 528 Posts have hosted a Red Cross Blood drive this year and collected 10,501 units of blood. That means that OHIO has donated 1/3 of the units of blood that has made The American Legion #4 in the

During heightened times in our Nation's history which include, World War II, Vietnam, Septem-Committee passed a resolution to ber 11th, and the Coronavirus recognize Departments and Posts Pandemic; the American Legion that produced the most blood in a Family has always been committed to the Blood Donor Program during these critical periods.

The response from American Legion Posts during the Coronavirus Pandemic has been essential for The American Red Cross. Even with social distancing, forced restrictions, and mandates. Posts and Legionnaires are still willing to provide for those in need.



## **Buddy Check**

The American Legion activates national Buddy Checks to save veteran lives amid rising suicide rates, urges Congress to pass bill to help.

Posts across the country step up veteran-to-veteran outreach to support those at high risk around Veterans Day.

INDIANAPOLIS (October 29, 2020) — As COVID-19 cases rise and the holidays approach, The American Legion is activating its Buddy Check program to save veteran lives through peer support check-in calls. The nation's largest veterans organization is also urging Congress to pass the Buddy Check Bill which will make wellness checks a national priority for the Department of Veterans Affairs. With military suicides up 20% over this time last year, Legionnaires will make thousands of check-in calls to at-risk veterans across the nation, to offer support and access to health and wellness programs in the week surrounding Veterans Day and into the weeks

The American Legion warns that veterans can be at particular risk for depression and suicide around the holidays and into the winter months. Many veterans are disproportionately hard-hit by the pan-

demic due to age, chronic health issues, post-traumatic stress disorder and isolation. The Buddy Check program is designed to give Legionnaires the tools to make contact, engage in conversation, assess risks and direct veterans in need to the appropriate services.

"The American Legion knows from 100 years of experience that it's veteran-to-veteran contact that can make the difference for someone in a crisis situation," says James W. "Bill" Oxford, national commander of The American Legion. "So, we're putting some muscle behind this effort and giving our members the tools they need to reach out to fellow veterans in their hometowns who may be hard hit by the triple whammy of the pandemic, isolation and the holidays."

The American Legion is also urging Congress to unanimously pass the Buddy Check Bill introduced with bi-partisan support from Sens. Joni Ernst, R-Iowa; Doug Jones, D-Ala.; and Maggie Hassan, D-N.H. The legislation will require VA to establish a "Buddy Check Week," as well as provide educational opportunities, materials and references for veterans to learn how to conduct personal wellness checks. The

bill also compels VA to expand resources for the Veterans Crisis Line to handle any potential increased volume during the designated week.

"Veterans are in crisis, and we need Congress' help to take this program to the next level and stem the tide of suicide among our nation's veterans," Oxford said. "We need all hands on deck and all boots on the ground to fight for our nation's veterans, just like they fought for us."


