The 106th Department Convention for The American Legion Department of Ohio was held at the Holiday Inn Cleveland South in Independence, Ohio from July 11th to July 13th, 2025. Legionnaires from around the state gathered to handle official business of The American Legion Department of Ohio. This year's Convention featured Platinum level sponsor Arrow International, Inc. as well as Gold sponsor, Grover Gaming and Silver level sponsor, Cuyahoga County Veterans. Next were poignant speeches from attending distinguished guests. First up was James Trakas, Councilman of the City of Independence, giving welcoming remarks and delivering the convention proclamation. Following Mr. Trakas was The American Legion Auxiliary Department of Ohio former President Louise Smerk and newly elected Sons of The American Legion Detachment Commander Jeff Vrabel Jr., bringing greetings and introducing their attending officer entourages. Next Americanism Programs video greetings were given by Dajeun Dickerson Jr., Buckeye Boys State Governor; Patience Pershing, Department Oratorical Contest Winner and National Oratorical Contest participant; as well as Abigail Matos, Kateri Sherman, Edward DeLoye, Noah Reardon, Iris Weisstein and Justin Thompson - Americanism & Government Trip participants. These bright youth leaders certainly give hope for the future of our great country. Rounding out Friday's joint session was the introduction and elevator speeches of the high Department office candidates. At close Bagpiper, Brody Alexander gave a special thank you message to all veterans and their families in the audience. Brody's presence is unforgettable, every note he plays carries pride, purpose, and power.

Next, Credentials Committee Chair, Mel Baher gave the final Convention delegation strength report, which transitioned to the Nominations and Elections of Department officers for this upcoming year. 

Just a Bit of Order

Wait! Can we reconsider that one? - RONR Section 37

Meeting over, a bunch of decisions made for the good of the order, a little bit of socializing and then on the way home. About half the way home you start thinking that one of the decisions just seems like it may have been wrong or you wish you had more information to discuss before the decision was made. You talk to a few other members and they also feel that the discussion seemed rushed and wished to get a do over. YOU CAN - by using one of the "Motions that bring a question again before the assembly", (RONR Chapter IX).

You have four options; 1) Take

from the Table, 2) Rescind or Amend Something Previously Adopted, 3) Discharge the Committee, and 4) Reconsider. Now I could use a newsletter for each of these actions, and may do this in the future, but for now let's understand the general use.

Take from the Table is used when a motion was voted to "lay on the table," think of a table over in the corner, which moves the motion to a future point in the same session to consider a more im-portant item on the agenda. A motion to take from the table must be seconded, is not debatable and must pass with a majority vote for the discussion on the question to continue.

Reconsider is used to bring back a previous decision that was approved in the same meeting before adjournment. If you are in a multiple day meeting then the motion to reconsider must be brought before the next day's end after the decision. Key to this motion is that it must be brought by someone who voted for the original motion. Also, it must be seconded, is debatable if the

from the Table, 2) Rescind or original mo tion was debatable, Amend Something Previously and needs a majority to pass.

Rescind or Amend Something Previously Adopted is normally used to remove or change a previously approved action or policy. This motion is considered only after the meeting has adjourned or if while in the same multiple day meeting one full day has passed. In other words, an approved policy in day one can be rescinded or amended in day three or greater, otherwise in day two you would reconsider. This motion must be seconded, is debatable, and passes with 2/3 rising vote if no prior notification and majority otherwise.

Discharge a Committee is used when a body or board has committed (referred) a question to a committee, wants to take the question back for further consideration, and the committee has not yet reported. This action makes sense when the body learns new information, wants to give it more time on the floor, feels they actually have more expertise than the committee to

make this decision, and alike. It is also useful to pull the question back for further discussion and then to form a special committee for this specific question. Bottom line is that the body sent it to committee and can pull it back to itself. The motion must be seconded, is debatable, and requires a 2/3 rising vote for passage if the body was not previously notified, majority vote otherwise.

As many may know the American Legion Riders mission is supporting the American Legion through motorcycle riding, promoting safety, providing social opportunities, and participating in events and charities to benefit veterans, their family and our community.

What some may not know is that the Ohio ALR Program is one of the fastest growing programs under a non-profit organization. The Ohio ALR has an active 131 chapters with an average of two new charters each year. I have a goal to have the average of 5 new chapters each year. The over all total of Ohio ALR members is 2000 and continues to grow each year. Getting each District Director involved in person or on TEAMS is a must to bridge the gap to united the Ohio for success.

Federal Electronic Health Records

The Federal Electronic Health Records (EHR) System is being rolled out to all VA facilities as soon as 2031. The purpose is to make transition from military to civilian life easier as the veterans records will already to in the new system. This streamlines the process of veterans leaving the military and seeking care at a VA facility. Another key point is allowing Doctor more time to speak with patient's vice looking through records on the computer. It also reduces repeated tests like imaging and diagnostic testing due to results from the military and community care providers already in the system. Allowing Doctor to review test that have already been done.

Expanded Burial Benefits for Veterans receiving Hospice Care

The VA announced July 10, 2025, a temporary expanded

burial benefit per the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act. The new Law allows eligible veterans that are discharged from VA care facilities and receive VA provided hospice care at home and pass between July 1, 2025, and October 1, 2026. To receive the full burial benefit allowance. Previously veterans may not have been entitled to the full amount.

The National Security Commission is responsible for reviewing items pertaining to various security issues that involve such items as cyber security, security of our boarders, our armed forces, their equipment and numbers so we don't get into a position where we can't maintain our presence in areas needed to ensure our safety. The Commission is also involved in military benefits and quality of life items that face our armed forces as well as the veterans that have served. These issues are addressed by either creating Resolutions to address the items or approve submitted resolutions by other committees or individuals. These resolutions are presented at the department convention to

be accepted and once accepted, move on to the national convention. If the resolution is passed at the national level, it will then be presented to congress for possible action.

National Security Commission is responsible for maintaining are:

Operation Comfort Warriors

Operation Comfort Warriors is a program dedicated to meeting the needs of wounded, injured or ill military personnel by providing them with comfort items not usually supplied by the government. OCW ensures that patients at U.S. military hospitals and warrior transition units are given items like sweat suits, DVDs, puzzles, electronic devices, books, calling cards and more. OCW also provides larger items such as ping pong tables, entertainment centers, computers, kayaks and other recreational goods for use by wounded warriors in common areas.

National Emergency Fund

The National Emergency Fund, created in response to Hurricane Hugo in 1989, has provided more than \$8 million in direct financial assistance to American Legion Family members and posts. By providing this emergency funding, NEF has prevented damaged posts from closing and enabled American Legion Family members to recover from tragedy.

POW/MIA Advocacy-Empty Chair

The American Legion is committed to achieving a full accounting of all POW/MIAs from the Gulf Wars, Vietnam War, Cold War, Korean War and World War II.

the Boys State scholarship selection committee. His dedication has impacted thousands of students, offering them opportunities to grow in confidence, leadership, and civic understanding.



4th Grade Flag Education **Program**

The Department of Ohio is pleased to present the 4th Grade Flag Education Program. This is a brand new program to Ohio.

The 4th Grade Flag Education consists of the "Our Country's Flag" comic book from National Headquarters and a test with 20 questions - both multiple-choice and true/false - and a short essay, which is used as a tiebreaker.

The Flag Education Test is given in participating elementary schools during the month of November to coincide with Veterans Day.

The test is open to 4th Grade elementary students in all public, private, and home schools.

Each student participating in the Flag Education Test Program takes the same test. The answers on the test are scored against a standardized answer sheet.

Students are given one hour to complete the test at school. No part of it is to be taken home. Also, students MAY NOT use their comic book, notes, or other materials to assist while taking the test.

Tests and comic books may be ordered by contacting your local American Legion Post. The sponsoring Post will provide the test to the applicable school officials. If desired, the Post may also participate in administering and grading the test.

There will be a male and female District winner. Each winner will be invited to attend the District Conference to be awarded.

Yet, we must try to honor them, not for their sakes alone, but for our own. And if words cannot repay the debt we owe these men, surely with our actions, we must strive to keep faith with them and with a vision that led them to battle and a final sacrifice. The willingness of some to give their lives so that others might live never fails to evoke in us a sense of wonder and mystery. I have known that same poignant feeling as I looked out across the rows of white crosses and Stars of David in Europe, in the Philippines, in the military cemeteries here in our own land. Each one marks the resting place of an American hero. They span several generations of young Americans, all different and yet all alike, like the markers above their resting places. All alike in a truly meaningful way. As we honor their memory today, let us pledge that their lives, their sacrifices, their valor, shall be justified and remembered for as long as God gives life to this nation."


Department Golf Outing Hosted by Kettering American Legion Post 598


