Commander's Role

- Leadership
- Running the meetings
- Ensure a culture of respect, inclusiveness and equity
- Knows all requirements for the Post/Squadron/Chapter/Unit and ensures that they are being met
- Knowledge



The Role of Leadership

- Be the example
- Delegate yet hold officers accountable
- Take charge when there are issues
- Be the face of the organization to the community
- Recognize member's strengths and encourage them to be used accordingly
- Listen, listen, listen



- Act as the meeting facilitator
- Prepare an agenda
- Ensure that the meeting is run in proper order and that all ceremonial elements are performed; bring back to agenda
- Ensure that all decisions are properly voted upon and that they are documented appropriately
- Ensure that all members have a voice
- Ensure that unruly behavior is not tolerated
- Tie breaker





The Ceremony

Why is the ceremonial part of the meeting important?

- Bonds members together for a common purpose; Veterans Affairs, National Defense, Americanism, Children and Youth
- Lays the groundwork for respectful behavior at the meeting
- Reiterates the purpose of the American Legion
- Provides standardization across the organization ensuring we conduct meetings properly, honor veterans responsibly, and maintain our roots from our life in the Armed Services



- Embrace diversity and be the example for others
 - Different skin color
 - Different ways of thinking
 - Different religions
- Ensure inclusiveness
 - Everyone has a voice
 - Make it comfortable for them to participate
- Ensure equity
 - Everyone should be treated the same
 - No tolerance policy for anything else

Commander's Role in the Financials

- Varies depending on Post assets, finance officer experience, size of the Post and its programs, past history of the Post
- Commander's main role is to ensure the integrity of Post financial management
- Visibility to the membership is vital; Members deserve to know how Post money is managed and spent



Commander's Role in Membership

- Be positive in all recruiting and retention activities
- Be a proud Legionnaire show it set the example
- Think of membership as a continuing program not an annual program
- Ensure that the 1st Vice has what they need to succeed
- Dare to be different try new things



Commander's Role in Department/District

- Ensure that required forms are filled out accurately and on time
- Attend District and Department functions to learn about new things that affect the Post and Programs
- Enlist the help of District Officers when unsure of what to do



Commander's Role in Licensing

- Ensure that all required licenses are submitted accurately and on time
- Ensure that all regulations and laws are being complied with
- Ensure that regulations and laws are reviewed periodically for changes
